

“A Warped, Frustrated Enemy”

1. Read Hebrews 2:14–18 and 4:14–16. How have the temptations of Jesus equipped him to be the perfect Savior for you? Discuss aspects of these passages that are difficult for you to believe, or at least to imagine.

What about Jesus' temptations is like the temptations you face? What about them is unlike your temptations?

2. “For the accuser of our brothers and sisters, who accuses them before our God day and night, has been hurled down” (Revelation 12:10). In what ways has Satan's strategy of accusing you been effective in undermining your faith and obedience?

What about Jesus and his work has been most helpful to you in counteracting Satan's accusations? How do you distinguish between Satan's discouraging accusations and valid conviction that comes from Scripture and the Spirit?

3. Satan attacks at your weakest moments. In what kinds of circumstances have you found yourself to be most vulnerable? What specific ministry of Christ to you is most helpful at such times? What habits can you form that would make you most open to the strength provided by Jesus during such times?
